

Resolution for appointing citizens to boards

Whereas it is in the best interest of Fayette County to have excellent boards making public policy and monitoring government programs.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved by the Fayette County Board of Supervisors that the following policy for appointments that are made by the Board of Supervisors be adopted:

Board appointments will have the following term limits:

One Year Appointments – 5 Term Limit
Two Year Appointments – 3 Term Limit
Three (or more) Year Appointments – 2 Term Limit

A former board member may be appointed after being off the board for one term.

Filling out a term for a board member who did not finish his/her term will not affect the term limit.

When a board vacancy occurs, the position will be advertised in county newspapers and on the Fayette County web site. Interested persons can indicate their interest by contacting the Auditor or the Board of Supervisors.

This resolution was adopted by the Board of Supervisors at their meeting on August 20, 2007.

The resolution was amended by the Board of Supervisors at their meeting on November 29, 2010, as follows:

Motion was made by Gayle Tellin and seconded by Mike Kennedy to amend the Resolution from August 20, 2007 regarding term limits for Board appointments to state that terms previously served, and/or filling out a term for a board member who did not finish his/her term will not affect the term limit. On roll call all voted aye, none nay, and the motion was carried.
