#### RESOLUTION DECLARING A DISASTER FOR FAYETTE COUNTY IN RESPONSE TO THE CORONAVIRUS DISEASE

WHEREAS, Fayette County has determined the impact from the Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) Pandemic has disrupted government services and will endanger the health and safety of the citizens of Fayette County; now

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Fayette County Board of Supervisors has declared a state of emergency authorized under Iowa State Statute and will execute the expenditure of emergency funds from all available sources, the invoking of mutual aid agreements and applying to the State of Iowa for assistance in response to this disaster.

On roll call, all voted aye, none nay, and the motion was carried.

Motion was made by Stanbrough and seconded by Bradley to close the courthouse to the public effective Monday, March 23, 2020 to limit the spread of COVID-19. The goal is

to protect the citizens and employees of Fayette County. The employees will continue to perform essential county services by appointment.
